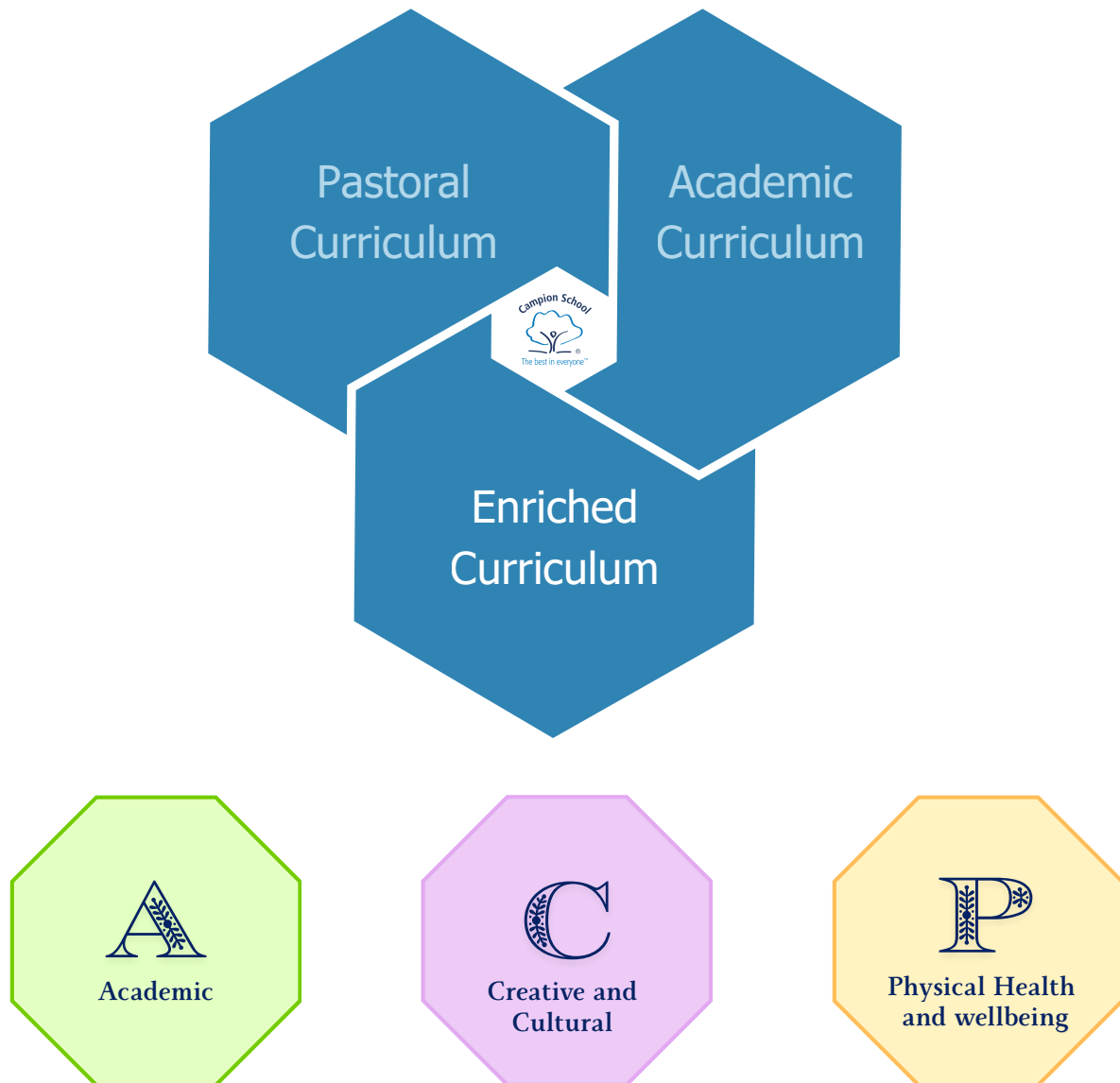

INTRODUCTION

WHAT IS IT?

The Champion Curriculum is structured around three key components, with Enriched Curriculum Electives playing a pivotal role.

In essence, these electives provide the experiences that sit beyond the Academic and Pastoral Curricula, offering pupils additional opportunities to develop and engage in a wide range of activities. There is an emphasis on character, skills, and values, alongside enjoyment. Pupils will get the opportunity to experience success outside traditional lessons, develop transferable life skills, explore interests and talents.

HOW IT WORKS

Electives will take place every Wednesday in Week B, period 5.

The programme has been designed to offer a wide range of elective options from the unique and quirky to the more common and traditional.

The focus is on development of your personal skills and character and not around assessment.

Electives are organised into three groups as follows:



You will participate in one elective from each group for a duration of one term. This translates to a total of **three** electives throughout the school year, following one of the pathways outlined above.

You will choose five electives from a variety of groups.

Regardless of which electives you participate in, your knowledge, understanding, and experience will be enhanced. Additionally, you will develop skills and personal qualities that many universities and employers consider appealing in prospective candidates.

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Animal Detectives: STEM in Action



Open to: Year 7

Curriculum links:

- Develop scientific understanding through the study of animal behaviour and welfare.
- Build empathy, responsibility, and ethical awareness around pet ownership.
- Encourage teamwork, communication, and problem-solving.
- Promote enquiry-based learning through practical investigations and research.
- Strengthen literacy, numeracy, and digital communication skills through meaningful real-world contexts.
- Inspire curiosity about careers linked to veterinary science, animal care, psychology, biology, and STEM industries.

Why sign up for this Elective?

If you are someone who loves to understand animal behaviour and adaptation, how senses communicate, interested in living organisms and their environment, then this elective is for you.

AMBITION – How this elective develops your character:

You will be learning about observing and classifying, collecting and interpreting data, Pattern recognition, evidence-based conclusions and ethical scientific discussion

RESPECT – How this elective develops your character:

You will learn about responsibility and empathy, animal welfare and ethics, community awareness, teamwork, leadership and respectful relationships between humans and animals

INTEGRITY – How this elective develops your character:

Through exploring responsible dog ownership and animal welfare, students understand the importance of doing the right thing even when no one is watching.

RESILIENCE – How this elective develops your character:

By engaging in investigations, teamwork tasks, and creative projects that require patience and persistence, students learn that scientific enquiry and problem-solving do not always lead to immediate answers and that mistakes are part of learning.

Open to: Years 7–9

- Science (ecosystems, habitats, biodiversity, fieldwork)
- Geography (human impact, sustainability, local environments)
- PSHE/Citizenship (environmental responsibility, community action)
- English (nature journaling, descriptive writing)

Why sign up for this Elective?

If you enjoy being outdoors and discovering the animals and plants around you, this elective is perfect. You will learn how to identify different wildlife species, take part in real conservation activities, explore local habitats, and help improve biodiversity on the school grounds.

Curriculum and subject links:

- Design & Technology – problem-solving, tools and making, understanding materials
- Science – forces, electricity, materials and their properties
- Maths – measuring, estimating, working with dimensions and budgeting repairs
- Computing – basic troubleshooting of simple electronic devices (where appropriate)
- Art – Creativity, aesthetic repair and upcycling

Why sign up for this Elective?

Choose Fix–It Lab if you enjoy solving problems, working with your hands, and figuring out how things work. You will take apart and repair a variety of items – from simple electronics, to fabric items, to mechanical objects – learning practical skills you can use in everyday life. It's a great way to be curious, creative, and work as part of a team while making a real difference by fixing things instead of throwing them away.

You will challenge yourself to tackle unfamiliar problems, learn new repair techniques, and take on increasingly complex projects, building confidence in your ability to solve real-world challenges.

You will take responsibility for your work, follow safety guidance, and approach repairs honestly – recognising when something needs more time, effort, or a different approach.

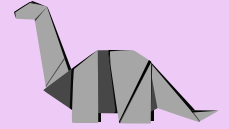
RESILIENCE – How this elective develops your character:

Curriculum and subject links:

Origami links naturally to Mathematics, Art and Design, and Science. Students explore shapes, symmetry, angles, patterns, problem-solving, and creativity while developing fine motor skills and following instructions.

Why sign up for this elective?

Discover how a simple piece of paper can be transformed into amazing creations. From animals and flowers to geometric patterns and decorative models, origami is a fun and relaxing activity that develops creativity, concentration, and patience. Whether you are a beginner or have folded before, this elective will help you learn new techniques and challenge yourself with increasingly complex designs.

AMBITION – How this elective will develop your character:

Students will develop ambition by progressing from simple folds to more challenging models, setting personal goals and taking pride in mastering new skills.

It connects to Science (especially Biology) by observing plants, animals, and ecosystems. It also links to Art and Design through sketching and layout, and Geography by exploring and recording features of the local environment.

Why sign up for this Elective?

You should choose Nature Diaries and Journaling if you enjoy being creative and spending time both indoors and outdoors. It allows you to explore nature on short walks and then record your ideas, drawings, and observations at your desk. It is a calm and enjoyable way to improve both writing and creativity.

AMBITION – How this elective develops your character:

This elective encourages ambition by helping you develop your skills over time. You will aim to improve your writing, make your observations more detailed, and create thoughtful, high-quality journal entries.

RESPECT – How this elective develops your character:

You will learn to respect nature and the environment by observing carefully and responsibly. It also builds respect for others' ideas and creative work when sharing journals and giving feedback.

INTEGRITY – How this elective develops your character:

Nature Diaries and Journaling helps develop integrity by encouraging honest and original work based on your own observations and experiences. You will take pride in producing work that reflects your own ideas.

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Reel Stories: Exploring the World of Film

- PSHE (exploring themes, perspectives, culture and social issues)

Why sign up for this Elective?

Do you enjoy watching films and want to learn how they are made? In Film Studies, you will explore a range of films, discover how directors use camera angles, sound, editing and special effects, and learn how films tell powerful stories. - Sociology (society, behaviour and social issues)

Why sign up for this elective:

Are you interested in solving mysteries, understanding criminal behaviour and exploring how justice is delivered? In Crime and Criminality, you will investigate famous crimes, examine how laws have changed over time and explore the role of the police, courts and prisons. 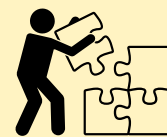
