Let someone know IMMEDIATELY - either a member of staff, your parents or an Anti-Bullying Ambassador.

Listen to the advice that you are receiving about telling and listen to yourself. If someone else's actions or behaviours make you feel uncomfortable or upset then you have the right to report it.

Keep reporting it until someone listens.

Statement

Campion school considers bullying behaviour to be something that is carried out several times on purpose.

All forms of Bullying

Verbal

Insults, name calling, threats and intimidation.

Indirect

Spreading nasty rumours, excluding someone from social groups

Physical

kicking, punching, hitting, taking belongings and an act of violence with intent to harm.

Cyberbullying

Tormented, threatened, harassed, humiliated or otherwise targeted using any social media platform. Misuse of associated digial technology such as phone cameras and video aids.

Will be taken very seriously and the consequences for any forms of bullying behaviour will be dealt with severely.
