Our priority is to ensure every student knows how to access support if needed, and that parents and carers feel confident in keeping their child safe.

Staying Safe During the Holidays

During the break, routines change, and young people may spend more time socialising, travelling independently, or using digital devices. Please take a moment to discuss the following with your child:

- Where they are going and who they are with
- How to travel safely, especially when it is dark
- Being aware of their surroundings and avoiding
- risky situations
- Safe use of social media and messaging apps
- Who they can talk to if they feel worried or
- uncomfortable

Small conversations before the holidays can make a big difference.

New Confidential QR Code

We are pleased to share that students can now report any safeguarding concern confidentially using the new QR code reporting system available on the school website. This allows young people to share worries, whether about themselves or someone else, quickly, safely, and discreetly. The system is monitored daily by the safeguarding team during term time.
