
Equipped for Excellence

As we return from the Easter holidays, we would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our school equipment expectations and ask for your continued support in ensuring that students come to school fully prepared each day.

Having the right school equipment is important for several reasons:

Supports Learning – having pens, pencils, rulers, and other materials ensures students.

Reduces Disruptions – if students come prepared, lessons can run smoothly without time wasted borrowing or searching for supplies.

Boosts Confidence – being prepared helps students feel more engaged and ready to learn, leading to better focus and achievement.

All students are required to have, at a minimum, a reading book, a scientific calculator, and a pencil case containing a blue, black, and red pen, a pencil, a ruler, a mini whiteboard pen, a scientific calculator and an eraser. Additionally, we encourage students to bring a glue stick and mathematical equipment as desirable extras.

Year 11 - The Final Push

Year 11 Attendance Challenge

As we approach the final stretch before exams, attendance has never been more crucial for our Year 11 students. Every lesson counts, and being in school every day ensures that students have access to all the support, revision, and guidance they need to succeed. As part of our attendance drive, we have challenged Year 11 to achieve 96% attendance as a cohort by 25th April. Students were asked how they would like to celebrate if they meet this goal, and they have chosen a well-deserved movie afternoon with refreshments—a fantastic way to celebrate their commitment to their education.

To further support students in their learning, we have launched our Period 6 Rewards Cards. For every additional study session attended, students will receive a signature on their card. Those who collect 10 signatures before exams begin will earn an exciting prize.

Wellbeing Support

We understand that this period can be stressful, so we want to remind students and parents about the importance of wellbeing. Here are some key reminders to help manage stress at home:

1. Encourage Balanced Study Routines

While revision is important, so is rest. Help your child plan a manageable revision schedule that includes regular breaks and allows time for relaxation. Encourage them to take short breaks between study sessions and avoid studying late into the night, as sleep is essential for concentration and retention.

2. Promote Healthy Lifestyle Choices

A balanced diet, hydration, and exercise all play an important role in maintaining focus and energy levels. Encouraging your child to take short walks, do some light exercise, or engage in a hobby can be a great way to relieve stress and clear their mind.

3. Practice Mindfulness and Relaxation Techniques

Mindfulness exercises and breathing techniques can help your child manage anxiety and focus their mind. Even a few minutes of calm breathing each day can help them feel more centred. You might want to explore apps like *Headspace* or *Calm*, which offer free resources for students.

4. Promote Open Communication

Talk with your child about their feelings toward the exams, and reassure them that their efforts are what matter most. Let them know that it's okay to ask for help and to share their worries with you, their friends, or their teachers.
